Cerebrovascular/Endovascular Neurosurgical Fellowship Program

Since 2009, Global Neurosciences Institute has offered fellows a well-established, one-year Cerebrovascular/Endovascular Neurosurgical Fellowship program.

Erol Veznedaroglu, MD, FACS, FAANS, FAHA, is the Program Director. Dr. Veznedaroglu leads Global Neurosciences Institute and is Director of Drexel Neurosciences Institute, where he holds the Robert A. Groff Chair, Department of Neurosurgery.

PROGRAM SPECIFICS

The requirements of the Cerebrovascular/Endovascular Neurosurgical Fellowship program include performing diagnostic and therapeutic procedures under the supervision of a board-certified endovascular neurosurgeon at each of several clinical training sites. The program director will define the level of supervision required for those procedures and provide that information to each clinical training site's medical staff services. Each fellow will maintain responsibility for case logs, as required. The fellow will provide services that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- The fellow will perform open cerebrovascular cases (e.g., AVM, aneurysms, carotids, etc.) consistent with the privileges granted by each clinical training site, and perform the full spectrum of endovascular procedures.
- The fellow will deliver lectures to medical residents on neurosurgery. The timing, content, number and duration of such lectures will be determined by the program director.
- The fellow will conduct and complete a minimum of one substantial research project to be submitted for publication in a peer-reviewed journal in cooperation with the Program Director.
- The fellow will work with those physicians who refer their patients to each clinical training site in order to collect information about the patient prior to seeing their patients.
- The fellow will collaborate with the Program Director and other faculty of the medical teaching service at each clinical training site to conduct additional research.

The fellow will agree to be bound by each clinical training site's current medical staff by-laws and written rules and regulations.

Participation by the fellow in this program will at all times be subject to, and conditioned upon, the fellow's continued appointment to the active medical staffs and maintenance of unrestricted medical staff privileges at each clinical training site.

ROTATION LOCATIONS:

This fellowship program provides training in cerebrovascular/endovascular diseases at several healthcare system locations in Philadelphia and its suburbs.

REQUIREMENTS:

The Cerebrovascular/Endovascular fellowship is open to applicants who have completed an ACGME accredited residency training in Neurosurgery.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Applications for the fellowship are accepted on an ongoing basis. All candidates are required to send in the following:

1. Updated CV
2. Cover letter describing career goals/anticipated start date
3. Three letters of recommendation
4. Valid certification from ECFMG (if applicable)
